Introduction

To register to SkillQuest is very easy. The process will ask you to open an account on Steam in order to access the video games available for the training of soft skills. This account will be then linked to SkillQuest to authorize the platform to access the gaming data collected by Steam. We will access exclusively the data related to the games that have been analyzed and cleared to be part of the SkillQuest platform.

Note: the result of the analysis of your gaming activity will take 24 hours to be available on the SkillQuest platform.

If you have already a Steam account you can use that one but be aware that we will require for you to make the account public in order to allow SkillQuest to access your data. Making an account public will give access to all the data about all the games that you have been playing on Steam. If you don't want that to happen we suggest for you to create a new account, specifically dedicated to the improvement of your soft skills, from which you will access SkillQuest-enabled games.

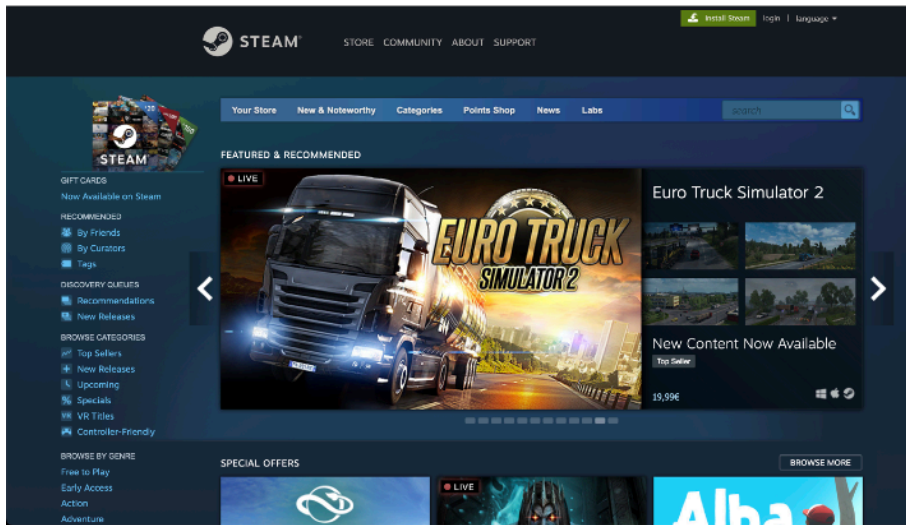
- If you don't have a Steam account start reading the following manual from the beginning, that is Chapter 1

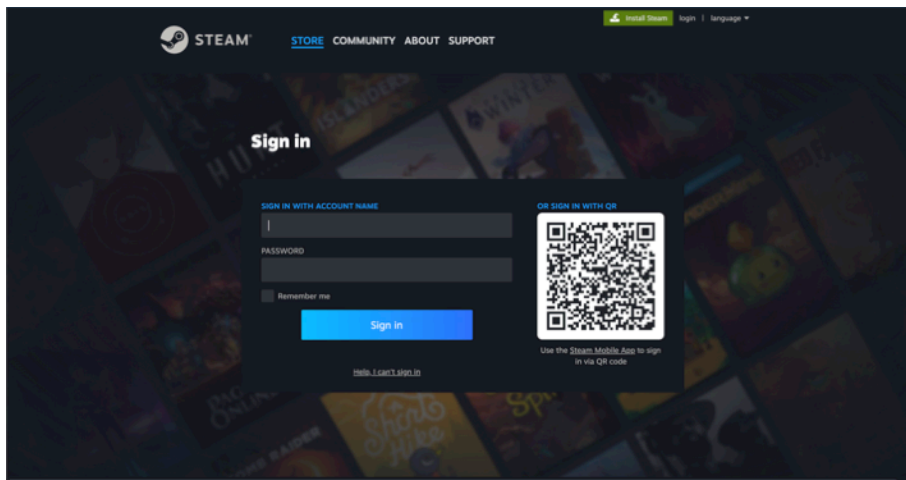

1. Open a new Steam account

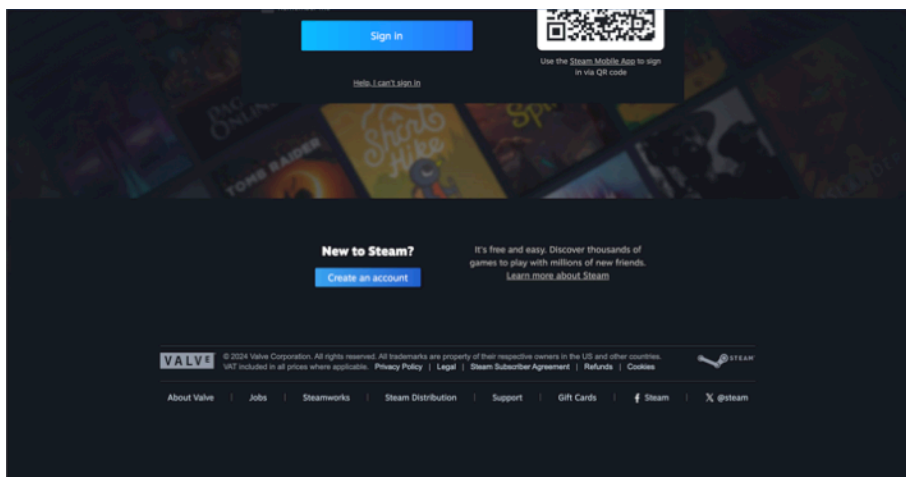
Go to: <https://store.steampowered.com/>



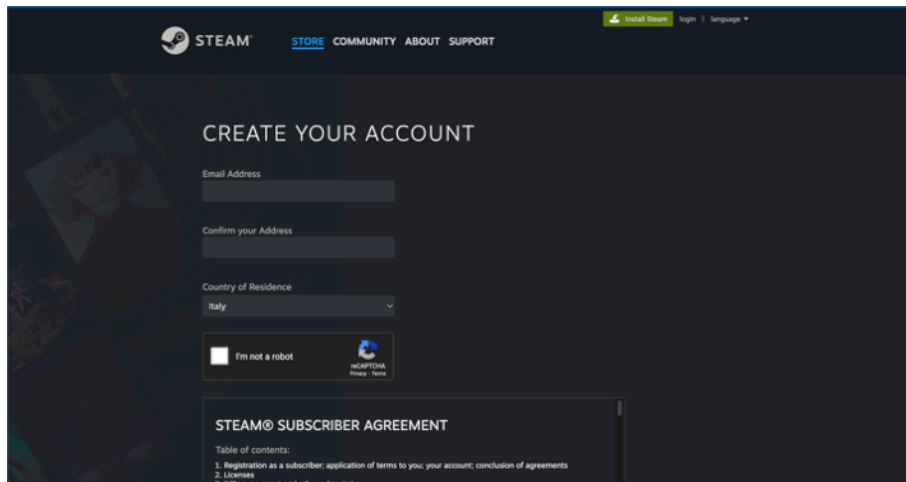
Click the “login” button on the top-right side close to the green “Install Steam” button. You will see this page:



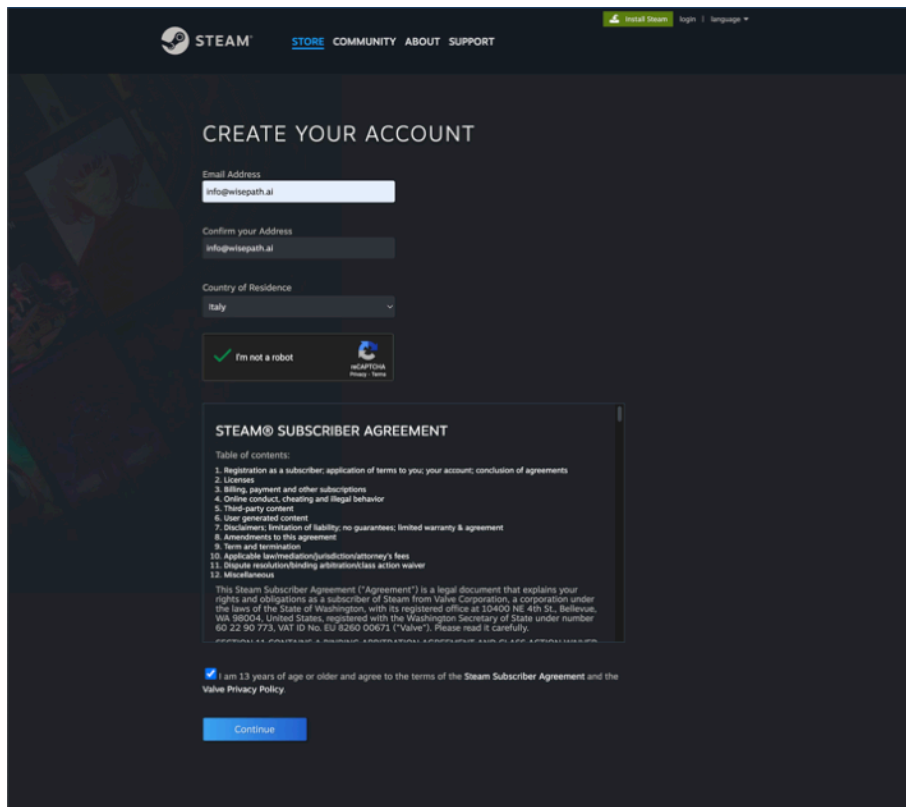
If you scroll at the bottom of the page you will see the “Create and account” button.



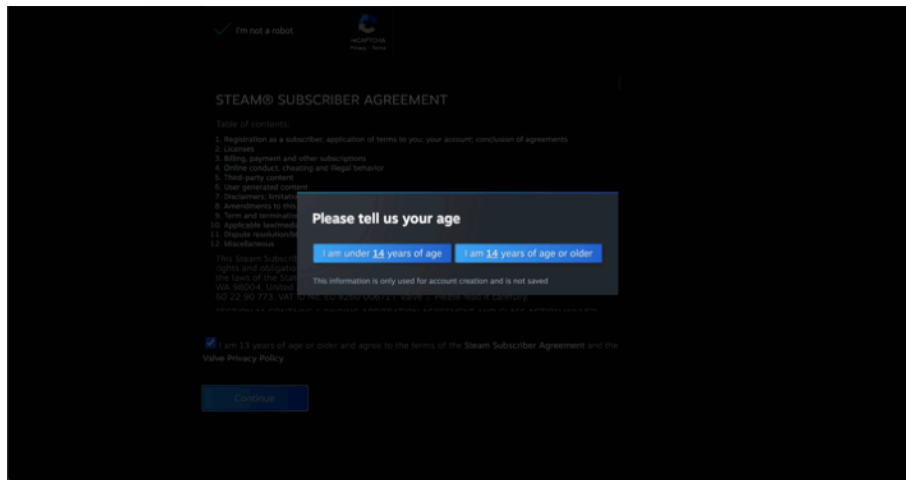
Click the button “Create an account”. This is what will appear:



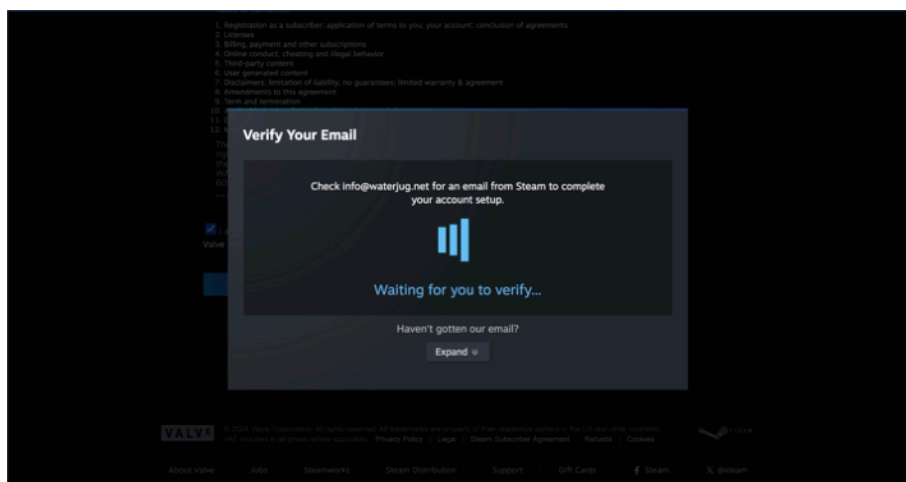
Fill all the fields:



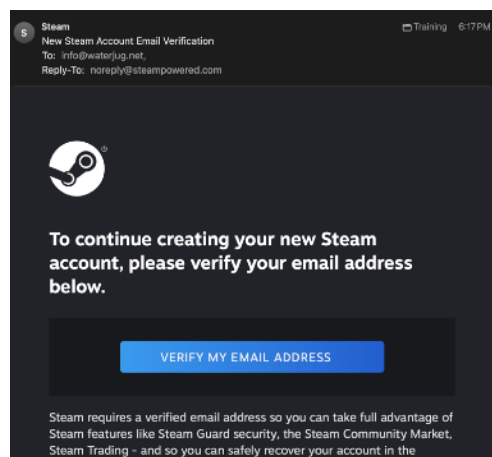
Check the box at the bottom, press continue, and confirm your age when this pop-up appears:



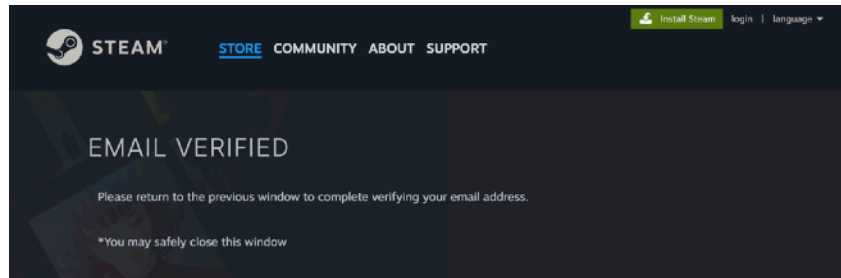
If you are 14 years or older and press the button on the right, then this message will pop up:



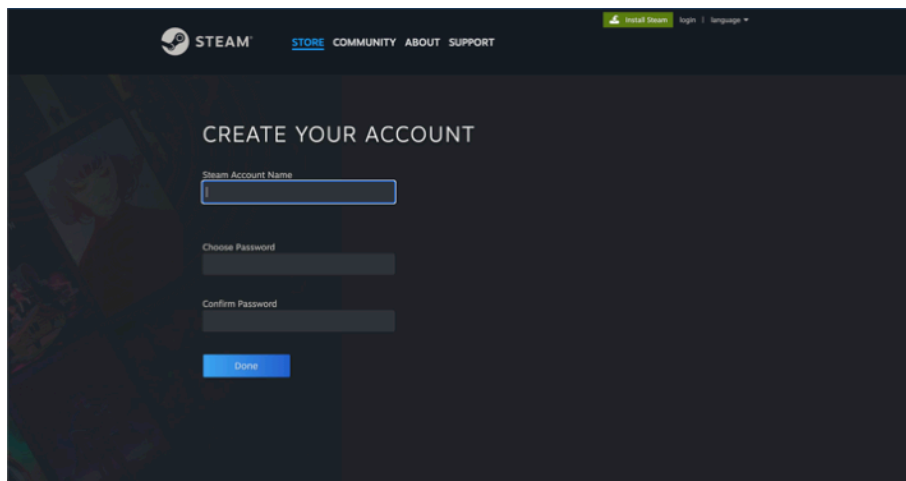
You will receive an email that looks like this:



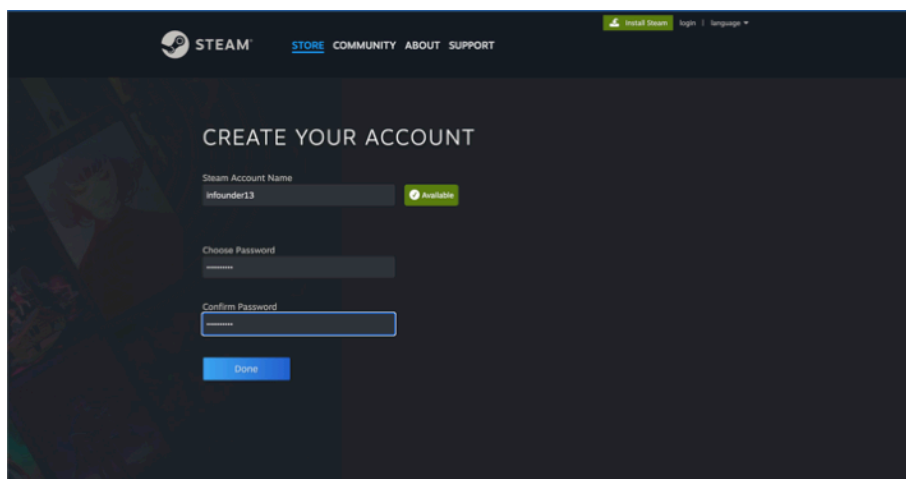
Press the “VERIFY MY EMAIL ADDRESS” button and you will receive a notification like this in a new browser window:



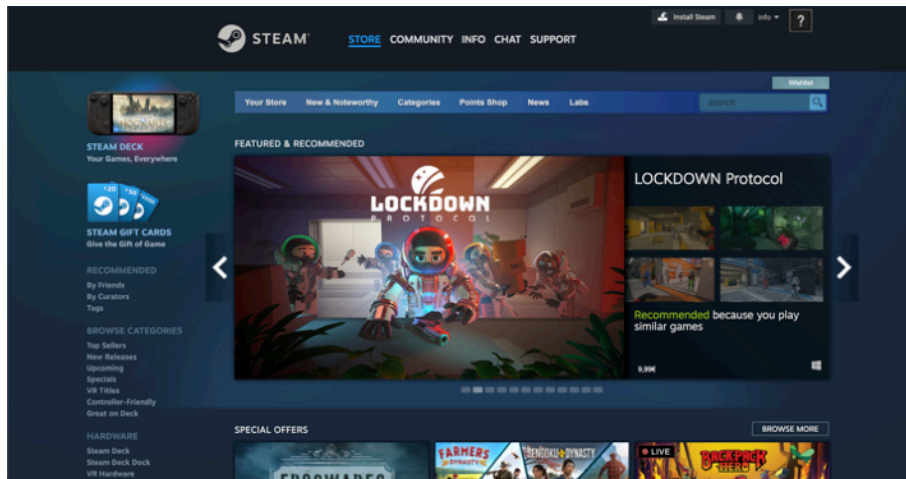
You can close the new window and go back to your registration page that will show the fields for you to create your account:



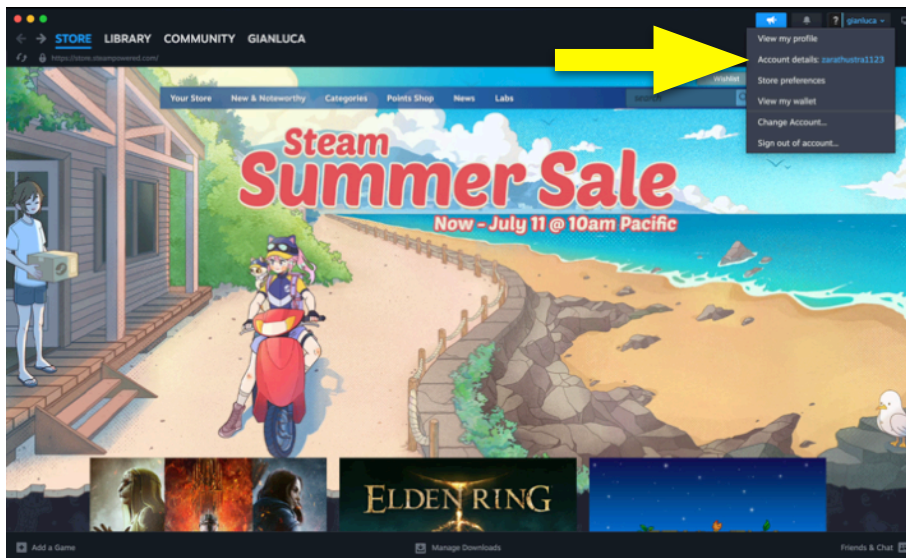
You should now see the following window: choose your Steam Account Name, the password, and press “Done”. **VERY IMPORTANT: The Steam Account Name is not the email address you used to register in Steam, it is whatever name you want that it’s still available in Steam (Steam will let you know if the name you choose is available or not, in case is not available you will have to chose a different one). Remember the Steam Account Name because it will be the username that Steam will ask you to login into the platform in order to play.**



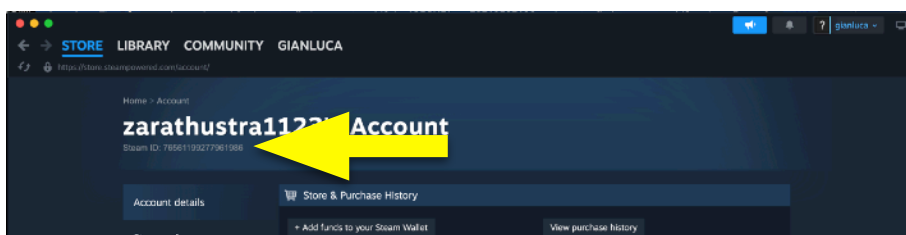
At this point your account is created and you will be able to enter the Steam world:



For future reference and in case technical support is needed, it is useful to know your own SteamID. The SteamID is your unique ID generated by Steam to identify your account. To view your Steam ID: In the Steam desktop application, select your Steam username in the top right corner of the screen. Select "Account details".

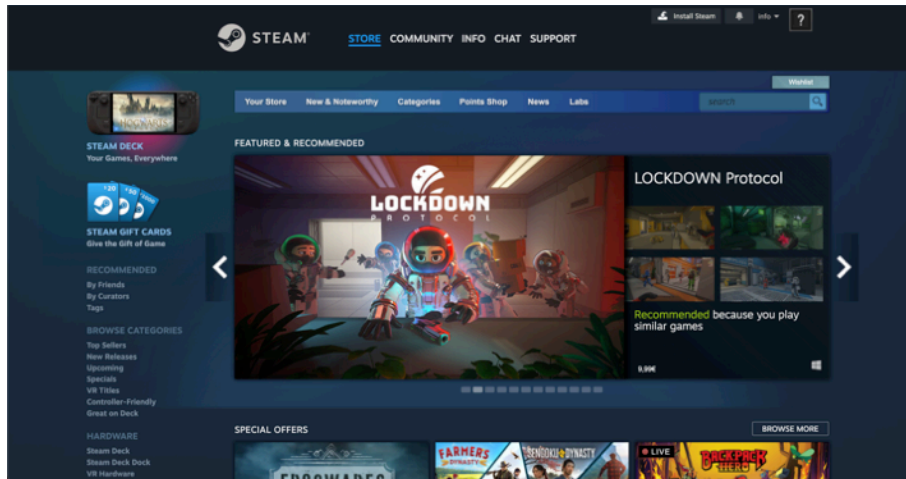

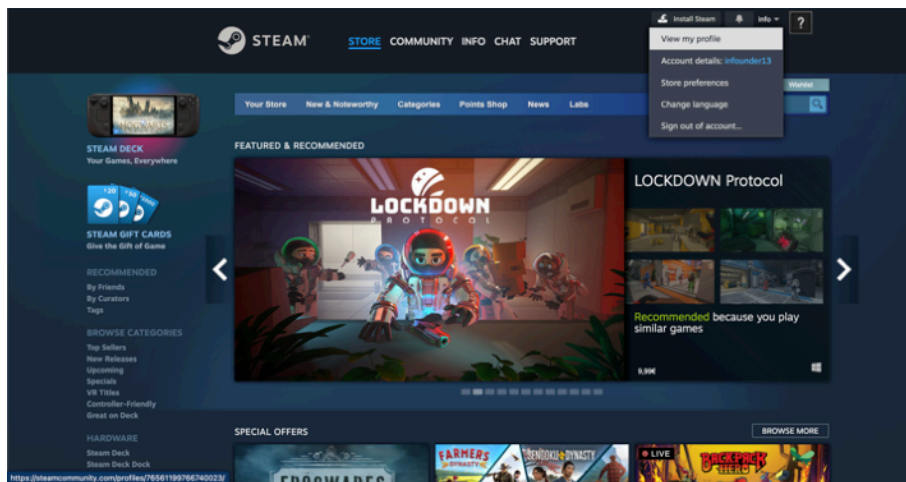


2. Make your Steam account Public

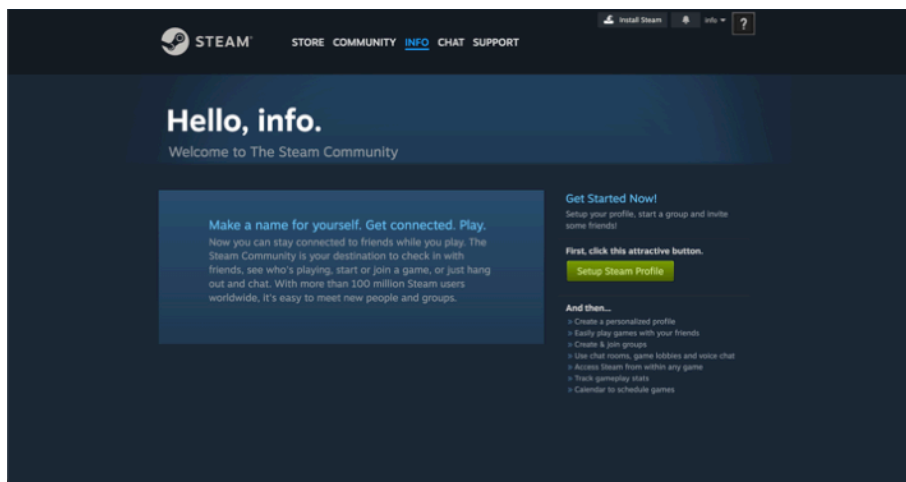
Now that you are inside your Steam account, let's make your account Public so that SkillQuest can access your gaming data to analyze your soft skills. Starting from the home page of your account:



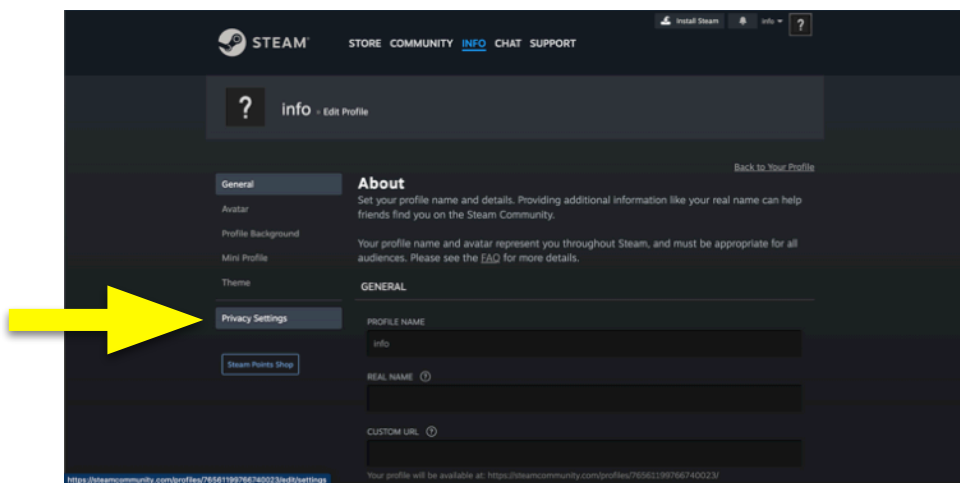
Click on the drop down menu that has your name on the top right part of the screen, just after the “bell” symbol (in the picture above the name of the use is “info”). You should see this menu:



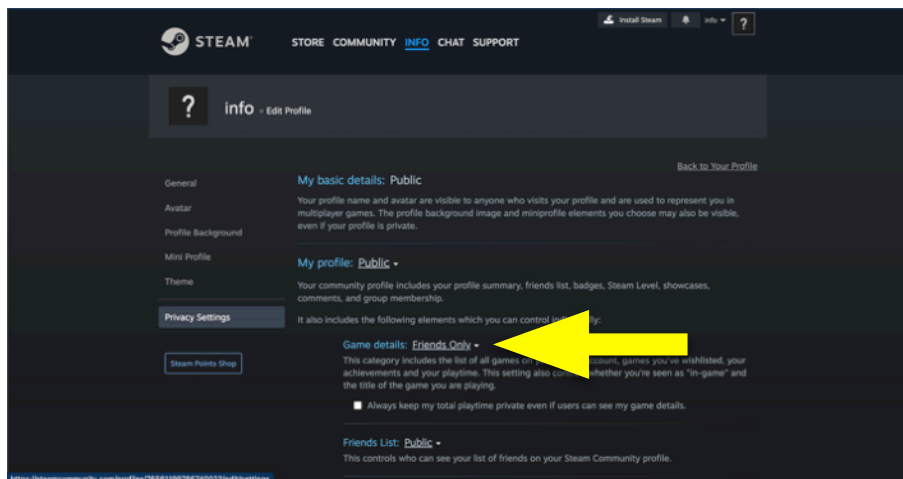
Select “View my profile” and you should see the following window:



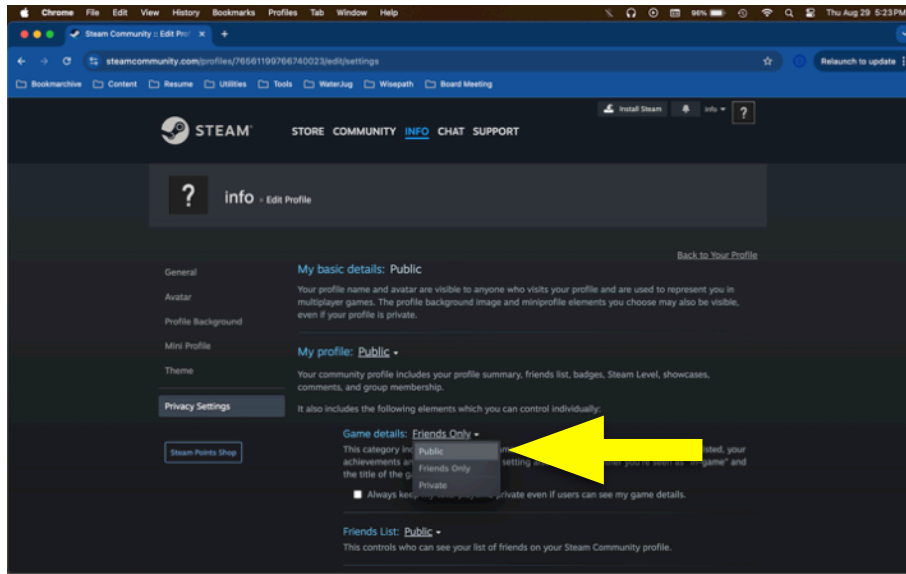
Select the green button “Setup Steam Profile” and select “Privacy Setting” at the bottom on the left side:



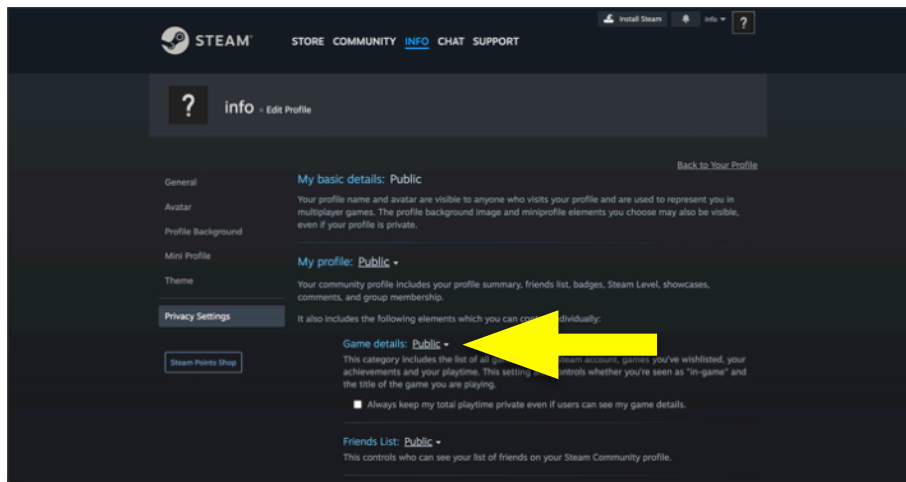
Now select the drop down menu “Game Details”:



Set it to “Public”:



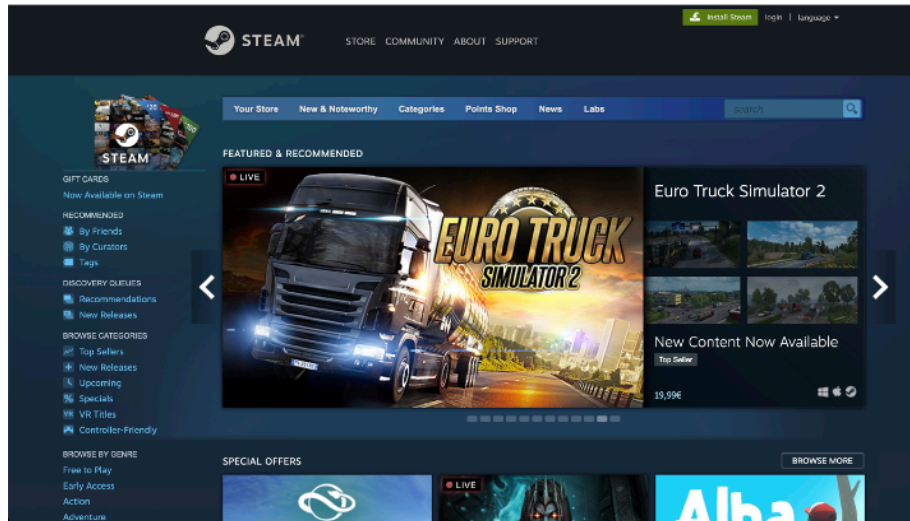
So that at the end it will look this way:

3. How to download a game and play in Steam

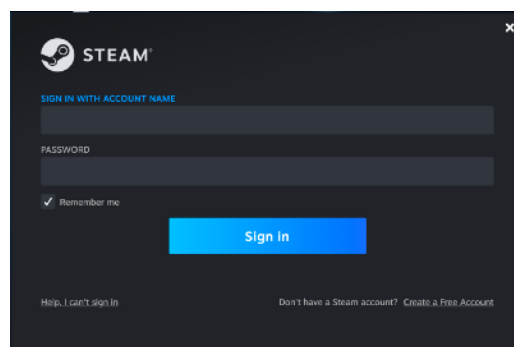
Now that you are registered and properly set up in Steam it is time to play so that we can begin collecting the data to measure your soft skills. Go back to the Steam website: <https://store.steampowered.com/>:



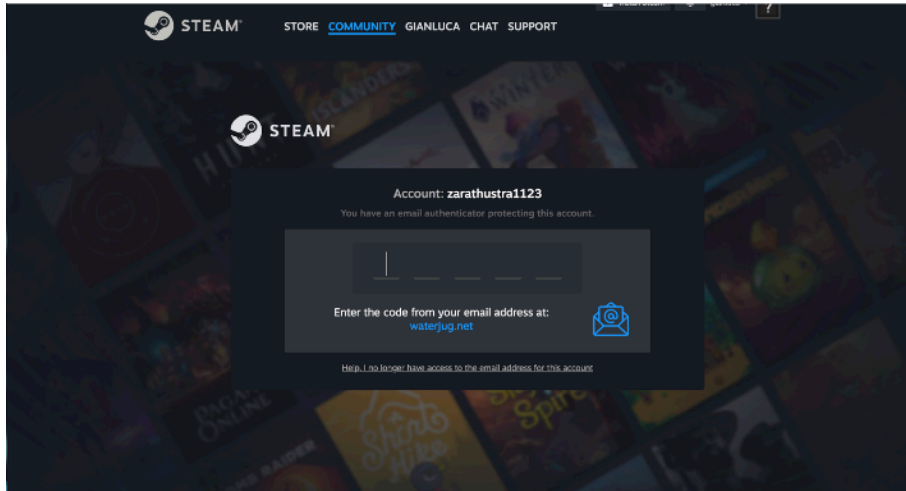
Click the green button on the top-right side “Install Steam”. This is what you should see:



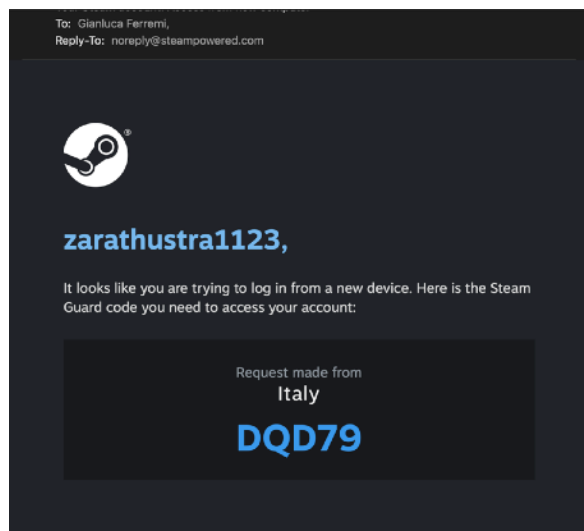
Click the blue tab “INSTALL STEAM” for your platform. (Screenshots show the process on a Mac.) Once the installation is done, execute the Steam application and this is what you should see:



Insert the account name and the password, that you already have or you just created, and press “Sign In”. You will be prompted with this request to insert a security code:



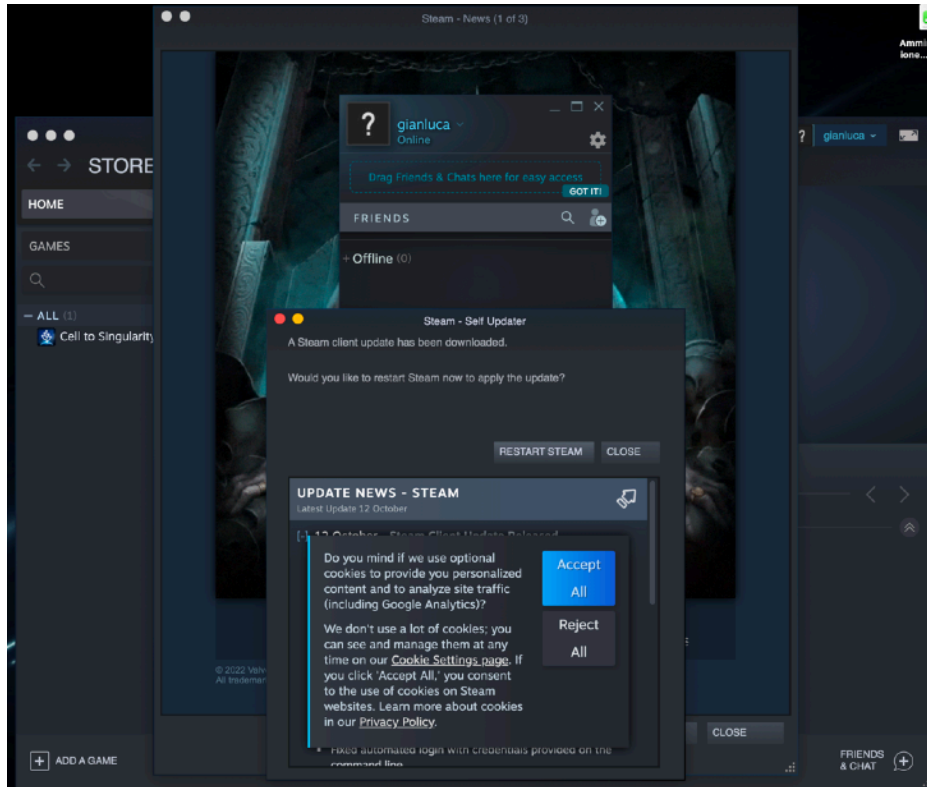
In the mail inbox that you used to register your account you will receive an email like this one:



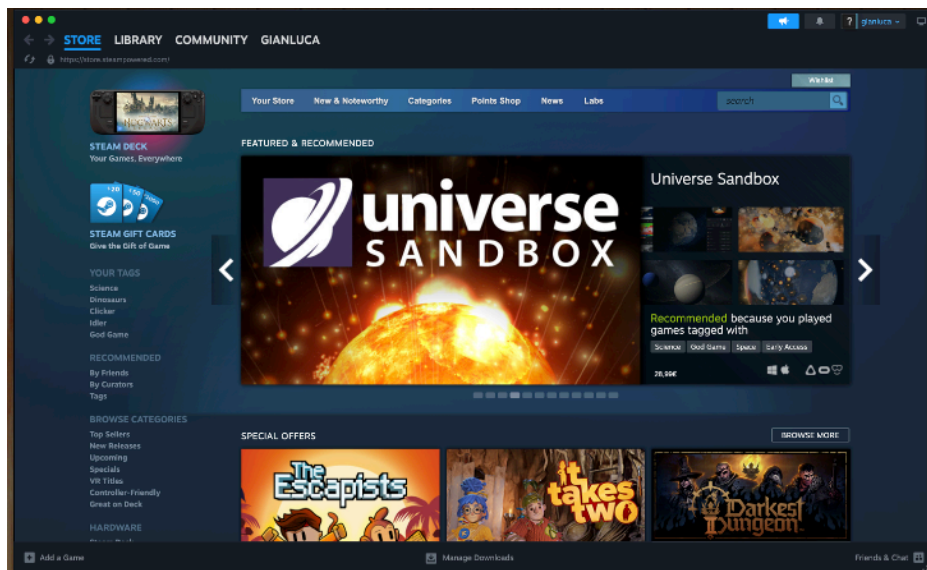
Insert the code you received by email in the page above and you will enter into your Steam account on the app.

After you sign-in Steam opens a bunch of windows. In the forefront you should see the cookie policy. Then depending from the version of Steam you've downloaded there may be some upgrades, close the window or restart Steam to include the new updates as you wish (in case you restart Steam you will have to login again).

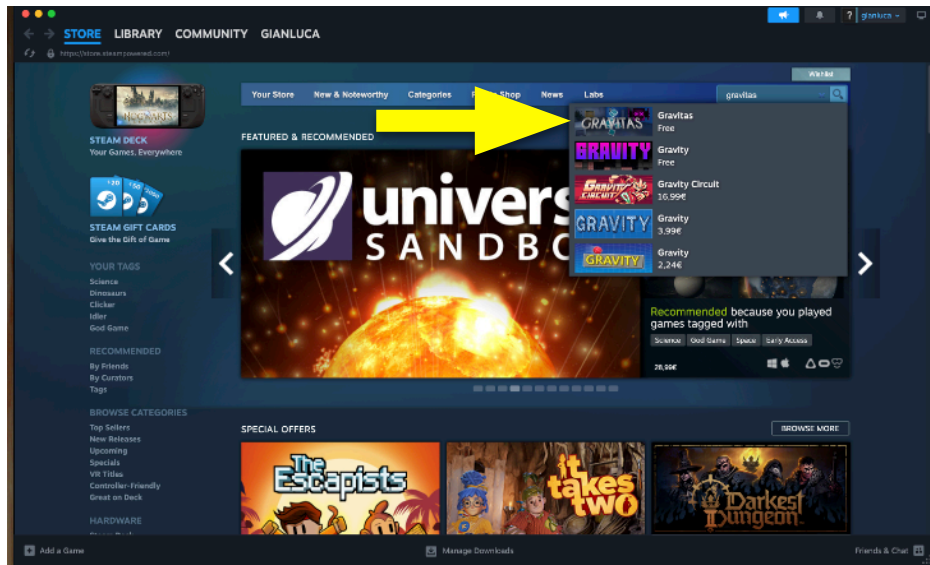
Steam also automatically opens the chat which you can close or use as you prefer (it is irrelevant for soft skills measurement). From time to time you may also be shown a News window, close it without hesitation (shown in image below).



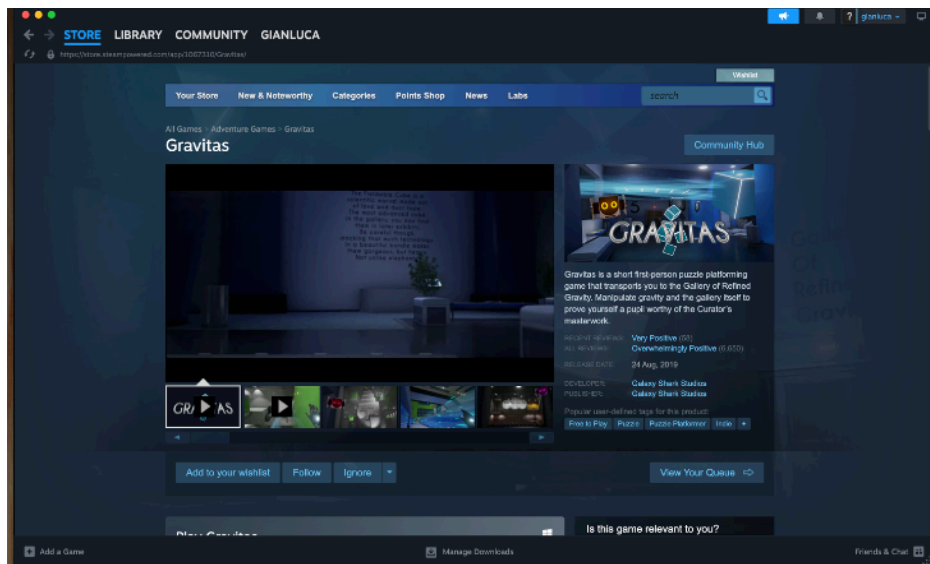
Delete all the small windows until you are left with this one which is the main window:



Insert in the search box the name of one of the games that SkillQuest has analyzed, for instance Gravitas, like in the picture below:



You will be brought to the game page:



If you scroll a little bit down you will see a “Play Game” and an “Add to Library” buttons (see picture in the next page). If you press the Add to library button, the game will be added to your library and you will see it when you press the “Library” tab at the top of the page. If instead you press the “Play Game” button, Steam will add the game to your library, download it into the Steam app in your computer and let you play right away.



While you play, Steam will store all of your gaming data so that SkillQuest will be able to analyze them to measure your soft skills.

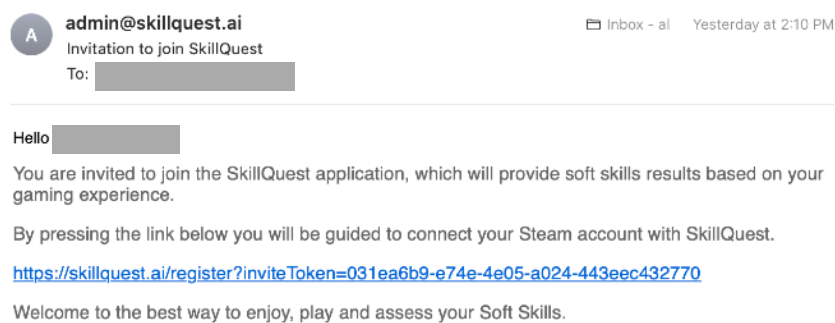
4. Connect SkillQuest to your Steam account

You can connect your existing or newly created Steam account to SkillQuest in two ways:

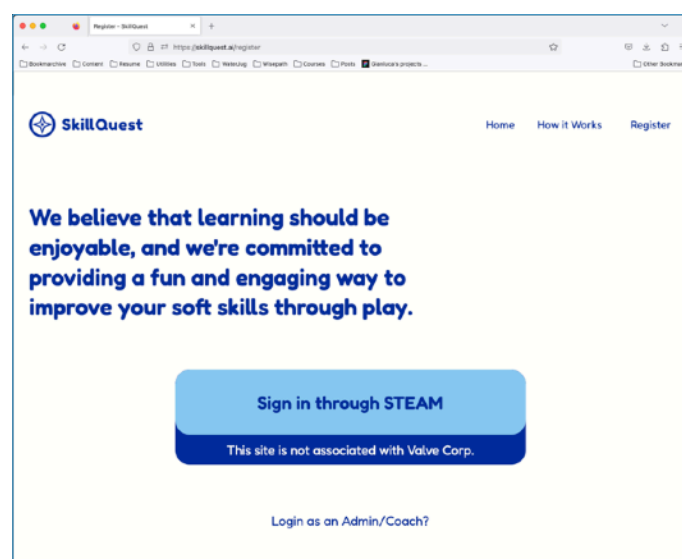
- As the result of an invitation from a SkillQuest Admin or Coach: in this case you should have already received an invitation from the email address admin@skillquest.ai with a link to the SkillQuest registration page. Please, follow the instruction in section 4.1.
- Directly from the registration page without any invitation: in this case you can skip section 4.1 and continue from section 4.2.

4.1 I have received an invitation from a SkillQuest Admin or Coach

At this point you should have received an email invitation from admin@skillquest.ai with the subject “Invitation to join SkillQuest” that looks like this:

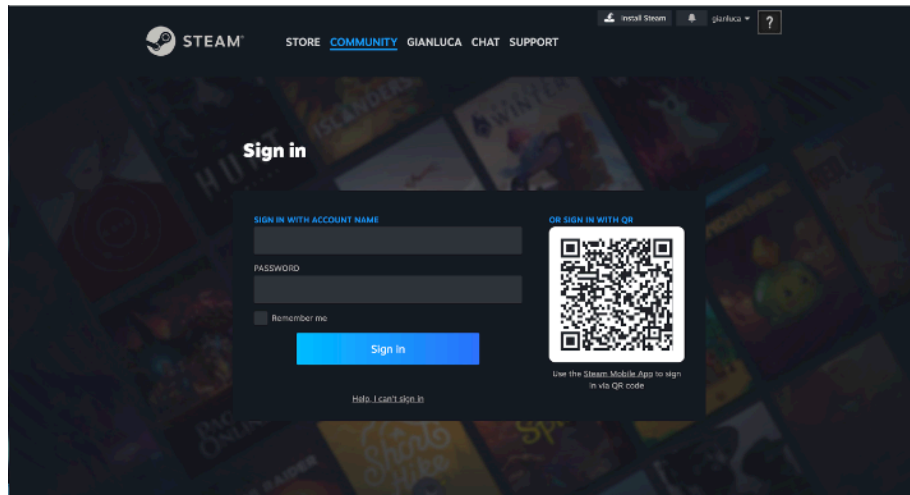
